A WARNING Failure to follow these warnings could result in a fire or explosion causing property damage, personal injury or death. To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, exposure to excessive microwave energy or injury, use only as intended and take the following precautions.

- 1 Read all instructions before using Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven.
- **2** Read and follow the specific PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY on page 4.
- **3** This appliance must be properly grounded. See GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS on page 7.
- **4** Install or locate this appliance only in accordance with the provided Installation Manual.
- 5 Some products in sealed containers, such as whole eggs and closed glass jars, can explode and should not be heated in the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven.
- **6** Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in this manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this appliance. This appliance is specifically designed to heat, cook or dry food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- 7 Teach children to not play with the appliance, its controls or any other part of the appliance. Hot contents can cause severe burns. Do not allow children to use the microwave oven.
- **8** Do not operate this appliance if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly or if it has been damaged or dropped.
- **9** Do not cover or block any openings on the appliance.
- **10** Do not store or use this appliance outdoors or in areas near water, such as near a kitchen sink, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool or similar locations.
- 11 Do not immerse the cord or plug in water.
- **12** Keep the cord away from heated surfaces.
- **13** Do not climb or sit on the appliance.
- **14** Keep fingers and clothes clear of drawer guides when the drawer is opened or closed. Fingers or clothes could be caught in the guides when the drawer is closed.

- **18** To reduce the risk of fire in the appliance cavity:
 - Do not overcook food. Carefully attend the appliance when paper, plastic or other combustible materials are placed inside the appliance to facilitate cooking.
 - Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bags before placing the bag in the oven cavity.
 - If materials inside the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™]
 Oven ignite, keep the drawer closed, turn off the
 appliance and shut off power at the fuse or circuit
 breaker panel.
 - Do not use the appliance for storage purposes. Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils or food in the appliance when not in use.
- Liquids, such as water, coffee or tea, can be overheated beyond the boiling point without appearing to boil, due to surface tension of the liquid. Visible bubbling or boiling when the container is removed from the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven is not always present. This could result in VERY HOT LIQUIDS suddenly boiling over when a spoon or other utensil is inserted into the liquid.

To reduce the risk of injury to persons when heating liquids:


- Do not overheat liquids.
- Stir liquids both before and halfway through heating.
- Do not use straight-sided containers with narrow necks. Use wide-mouthed containers.
- After heating allow the container to stand in the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven for at least 20 seconds before removing.
- Use extreme care when inserting a spoon or other utensil into liquids after heating.
- 20 If the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven light fails, consult a Sharp Authorized Servicer. Only qualified service personnel should service Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven. Contact 1-800-BE-SHARP for the nearest Sharp Authorized Servicer for evaluation, repair and/or adjustment.
- 21 This appliance should be serviced only by qualified service personnel. Contact nearest Sharp Authorized Servicer for examination, repair or adjustment.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

UNPACK THE APPLIANCE


Remove all packing materials from inside the appliance. Remove the feature sticker, if there is one, from the outside of the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven. Check the drawer for any damage, such as misaligned or bent drawer, damaged drawer seals and sealing surfaces, broken or loose drawer guides and dents inside the cavity or on the front side of the drawer. If there is any damage, do not operate the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven and contact your dealer or a Sharp Authorized Servicer.

IMPORTANT: DO NOT REMOVE THE WAVEGUIDE COVER LOCATED ON THE TOP OF THE OVEN CAVITY.



GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

This appliance must be grounded. The Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. It must be plugged into a wall receptacle that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with the National Electrical Code and local codes and ordinances. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current.



A WARNING Improper use of the grounding plug can result in a risk of electric shock. Do not use an extension cord. If the power supply cord is too short, have a qualified electrician or serviceperson install an outlet near the appliance.

If you have any questions about the grounding or electrical instructions, consult a qualified electrician or serviceperson.

BEFORE OPERATING

- Read and understand all instructions in this Operation Manual.
- Ensure the appliance is properly installed and connected to power according to all instructions in the included Installation Manual.
- Ensure all protective packaging materials and tape have been completely and correctly removed.

CONDITION OF UNIT

Do not operate any appliance with a damaged cord or after the appliance malfunctions or has been damaged in any manner. Return the appliance to the nearest authorized service facility for examination, repair or adjustment.

SERVICE AND REPAIR WARNING

Do not repair or replace any part of the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven. If the display, oven or touch controls fail, consult a Sharp Authorized Servicer.

RADIO OR TV INTERFERENCE

ABOUT THE MICROWAVE OVEN

ABSORB MICROWAVE ENERGY

When the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven is in use, ALWAYS have food in the cavity to absorb the microwave energy. The Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven is for food preparation only. It should not be used to dry clothes or newspapers.

OPEN AND CLOSE CAREFULLY

When opening or closing the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven quickly, food in the oven may be spilled. See CLEANING AND CARE on page 24.

WARM EXTERIOR IS NORMAL

It is normal for the exterior of the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven to be warm to the touch when cooking or reheating.

MAGNETRON CYCLING IS NORMAL


The magnetron can be heard cycling on and off during microwave use with power levels below 100%.

CONDENSATION IS NORMAL

It is normal for microwave use to produce condensation, the amount of which is related to food moisture content and room humidity.

DO NOT BLOCK VENT

NEVER cover or obstruct the vent over and under the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven. During microwave use, steam may come from the left side lower vent. Check the vent area after each use and wipe it down if needed.



ABOUT FOOD SAFETY

Cook foods to safe temperatures recommended by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). To check internal temperature of foods to determine doneness, insert a meat thermometer in a thick or dense area away from fat or bone.

AWARNING NEVER leave a thermometer in the food during microwave cooking unless the thermometer is approved for microwave use.

USDA RECOMMENDED TEMPERATURES

fish	145°F (63°C)
pork, ground beef/veal/lamb, egg dishes	160°F (71°C)
whole, pieces and ground turkey/chicken/duck, leftover, ready-to-reheat refrigerated, deli and carry-out food	165°F (74°C)

ABOUT MICROWAVE SAFETY

HOT CONTENTS CAN CAUSE SEVERE BURNS. DO NOT ALLOW CHILDREN TO USE THE MICROWAVE OVEN. Use caution when removing hot items. To avoid spills and burns, anyone using the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven must be able to reach it comfortably. Anyone using the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven can do so safely if they understand and take safety precautions, including the following.

ALWAYS USE POTHOLDERS

Use potholders to prevent burns when handling utensils in contact with hot food. Enough heat from the food can transfer through utensils to cause skin burns.

AVOID STEAM BURNS

Direct steam away from the face and hands. Slowly lift the farthest edge of a dish covering and carefully open cooking bags and popcorn bags away from the face.

MONITOR COOKING

Stay near the appliance when it is in use and check progress frequently to avoid overcooking food.

HANDLE FOOD CAREFULLY

Select, store and handle food carefully to preserve its high quality and minimize the spread of foodborne bacteria.

NOT FOR STORAGE

NEVER use the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven for storing cookbooks or other items.

ABOUT MICROWAVE COOKING

ARRANGE FOOD CAREFULLY

Place the thickest parts of the food toward the outside of the dish.

WATCH COOKING TIME

When following recipes or package instructions, check food for doneness a minute or two before the minimum time and add time as needed.

COVER FOODS WHILE COOKING

Covers prevent spattering and help foods cook evenly. Check cookbooks and recipes for cover suggestions, such as paper towels, wax paper, microwave-safe plastic wrap or lids. See ABOUT MICROWAVE UTENSILS on page 9.

STIR FOODS REGULARLY

Stir foods once or twice during microwaving. Whenever possible, stir from the outside to the center of the dish.

TURN OVER FOODS

Turn over foods such as chicken and hamburgers at least once during microwaving to speed cooking. Large items like roasts must be turned over at least once.

REARRANGE FOODS

Rearrange foods such as meatballs halfway through microwaving by moving pieces from top to bottom and from left to right.

ADD STANDING TIME

Standing time allows cooking to finish without overcooking food. After microwave cooking, remove food, stir if possible and cover for standing time.

CHECK FOR DONENESS

Look for signs indicating the cooking temperature has been reached. Doneness signs include:

- food steams throughout, not just at edges
- center of the dish's underside is very hot to the touch
- poultry thigh joints move easily
- meat and poultry show no pinkness
- · fish is opaque and flakes easily with a fork

Use a meat thermometer to check if foods are cooked to the safe temperature. See ABOUT FOOD SAFETY on the left column.

ABOUT UTENSILS

UTENSILS

It is not necessary to buy all new cookware for microwave cooking. Many pieces already in your kitchen can be used successfully in the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven.

To check if a dish is safe for microwave use, place the empty dish in the Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven and microwave on HIGH for 30 seconds. A dish that becomes very hot is not suitable for microwave cooking.

MICROWAVE COVERINGS

Use covers to prevent spattering and help foods cook evenly. There are several different coverings to suit unique needs.

Microwave-safe lids keep heat close to the food, hastening cooking, and oven cooking bags can be used for tenderizing large meats. Check cookbooks and recipes for more covering suggestions.

* IMPORTANT Vent plastic wrap and oven cooking bags so steam can escape. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.

ACCESSORIES

There are many microwave accessories available for purchase. Before buying accessories, evaluate carefully if they suit your needs. A microwave-safe thermometer indicates whether foods have been cooked to safe temperatures. Sharp is not responsible for any damage to the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven when accessories are used.


FOR MORE RECOMMENDATIONS

A good microwave cookbook can provide microwave cooking principles, techniques, hints and recipes.

ABOUT FOOD IN THE MICROWAVE

FOODS	DO	DO NOT
eggs, sausages, fruits and vegetables	 Puncture egg yolks before cooking to prevent bursting. Pierce skins of potatoes, apples, squash, hot dogs and sausages so steam escapes. 	 DO NOT cook eggs in shells. DO NOT reheat whole eggs. DO NOT dry nuts or seeds in shells.
popcorn	 Use popcorn specially packaged for microwave cooking. Listen for the popping of corn to slow to 1 or 2 seconds between pops to avoid overcooking. Use the special Popcorn feature by touching the POPCORN pad. 	 DO NOT pop corn in regular brown paper bags or glass bowls. DO NOT exceed the maximum cooking time listed in the package instructions.
baby food	 Transfer baby food to a small dish and heat carefully, stirring often. Check temperature before serving. Test temperature of bottles on your wrist before serving. Attach nipples to bottles AFTER heating. Shake well before serving. 	 DO NOT heat disposable bottles. DO NOT heat bottles with nipples attached. DO NOT heat baby food in original jars.
general	 Cut filled baked goods after heating to release steam. Stir liquids briskly before and after heating to avoid eruption. Use a deep bowl when cooking liquids and cereals to prevent boil-overs. Refer to the height of the side walls of the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven. 	 DO NOT heat or cook in closed glass jars or airtight containers. DO NOT use the microwave for canning, as harmful bacteria may not be destroyed. DO NOT deep-fat fry in the microwave. DO NOT dry wood, gourds, herbs or wet papers.

BEFORE OPERATING

BEFORE USE

- 1 Plug in the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven. ENJOY YOUR MICROWAVE TOUCH CLEAR AND TOUCH CLOCK appears on the display.
- **2** Touch the **STOP/CLEAR** pad.: appears on the display.

SET THE CLOCK

- **1** Touch the **Timer/Settings** pad once. The display shows *TO SET CLOCK ENTER TIME*.
- 2 Touch the number pads for correct time of day then touch the START/+30 SEC pad.

This is a 12 hour clock. If you attempt to enter an incorrect clock time, *ERROR* will appear in the display. Touch the **STOP/ CLEAR** pad and re-enter the time.

STOP/CLEAR

Touch the STOP/CLEAR pad to:

- · erase a mistake.
- · cancel the timer.
- · pause heating.
- · return the time of day to the display.
- · cancel a program.
- · cancel timed cooking.

OPEN OR CLOSE MICROWAVE DRAWER

IMPORTANT: Do not pull the drawer open by hand except in the case of emergency such as power failure. If necessary, push or pull the drawer gently and slowly.

TO OPEN MICROWAVE DRAWER

• Touch the **OPEN/CLOSE** pad on the glass touch control.

TO CLOSE MICROWAVE DRAWER

 Touch the OPEN/CLOSE pad on the glass touch control OR gently push on the drawer.

EASY WAVE OPEN ON/OFF

When the unit is plugged in, the default setting of Easy Wave Open is OFF. The white light on the center of the panel will illuminate once Easy Wave Open has been activated. When Control Lock is activated, the Easy Wave Open function is off.

To use the Easy Wave Open function, simply wave your hand in front of the sensor twice in consecutive motions. This can be either up and down or side to side motions.

EASY WAVE OPEN ON/OFF

• Hold the number **5** pad on the glass touch control for 3 seconds.

POWER OUTAGE

If the electrical power supply to the Sharp Microwave DrawerTM Oven should be interrupted, the display will intermittently show ENJOY YOUR MICROWAVE TOUCH CLEAR after the power is reinstated. If this occurs during cooking, the program will be erased. The time of day will also be erased. Simply touch the STOP/CLEAR pad and reset the clock for the correct time of day.

WI-FI CONNECT

The Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven is equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity. The oven's Wi-Fi will need to be turned ON in order to complete the Pairing process.

TURN OVEN'S WI-FI ON/OFF

• Touch the number **0** pad and hold for 3 seconds.

FAVORITES:

The Sharp Kitchen app lets you select and store your Favorite Smart Cook items in your FAVORITES section. Click on the heart icon to add your most frequently prepared dishes.

REMOTE START SAFETY INFORMATION

In order to operate the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven with the Sharp Kitchen app, you must enable the Remote Start feature. When the unit is plugged in, the default setting of Remote Start is OFF. Remote Start must be turned ON before operating the appliance with the Sharp Kitchen app.

 Touch the Timer/Settings pad 3 times to access the Remote Start function.

When using mobile device operation to control the appliance remotely, be sure to follow all safety procedures and guidelines as instructed in this operation manual. Failure to do so may result in personal injury, death or damage to property.

PAIRING

Pairing may be used to pair a new mobile device to the oven after the oven has already been connected to your home network.

 Touch the Timer/Settings pad 4 times to access the Pairing function.

REMOTE OPERATION

There is a 3-minute window after opening and closing the drawer in which you may operate the oven remotely with the app. After 3 minutes of inactivity, you must operate the oven manually at the control panel or open and close the drawer again to operate remotely.

 If you activate the appliance remotely, your oven will remain ON and in cooking mode even if your mobile device or home Wi-Fi become disabled.

ALWAYS ensure the oven cavity is prepared for cooking when operating the oven remotely with the app. Risk of oven damage or fire could occur. NEVER use the oven interior as a storage device for unrelated items or cook using the app remotely if the cavity is not properly prepared.  Touch the Timer/Settings pad 6 times to access the Wi-Fi Firmware Update function.

Your oven's Wi-Fi settings may be cleared by using the Wi-Fi Reset function. Clearing of settings may need to be performed when a new router or Wireless LAN is installed in the home or if transferring ownership of the oven.  Touch the Timer/Settings pad 7 times to access the Wi-Fi Reset function.

TIME COOKING

The Sharp Microwave Drawer[™] Oven can be programmed for 99 minutes 99 seconds (99.99). Always enter the seconds after the minutes, even if they are both zeros.

TO COOK:

- 1 Touch the **number** pads to enter cooking time.
- 2 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad for 100% power. The timer on the display counts down.

Note: For best cooking results and to avoid spatters, some foods should be covered. See MICROWAVE COVERINGS on page 9 and refer to hints by touching the **Help/Settings** pad for recommendations. Always allow steam to escape away from face and hands when removing any covering.

POWER LEVEL

There are eleven preset power levels. Using lower power levels increases the required cooking time, which is recommended for foods such as cheese and milk and long, slow cooking of meats. Consult a microwave cookbook or recipes for specific recommendations.

- 1 Touch the **number** pads to enter cooking time.
- **2** Touch the **Power Level** pad repeatedly until the correct level appears on the display. (For example, to defrost at 30% power, touch the **Power Level** pad eight times, and P 30 will appear on the display.)
- 3 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad.

SENSOR SETTINGS



The Sensor Cook center includes many Smart & Easy™ settings to cook the most popular microwaved foods without the need

to calculate cooking time or power level. Sharp's Sensor is a semi-conductor device that detects vapor (moisture and humidity) emitted from food as it heats.

ABOUT SENSOR COOKING

- Wait two minutes after initially plugging in the appliance before using a Sensor setting.
- Wipe off any moisture from the exterior of the food container and the interior of the microwave cavity before using a Sensor setting.
- The sensor works with foods at normal storage temperature.
 For example, popcorn would be at room temperature.
- Foods of different quantities than listed on the menu label can be cooked manually according to instructions found in any microwave cookbook.
- During the first part of sensor use, the food name appears on the display. Do not open the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven or touch the STOP/CLEAR pad during this part of the cycle, as the measurement of vapor will be interrupted. If the cycle is interrupted, ERROR appears on the display. To continue cooking, touch the STOP/CLEAR pad and cook manually.
- When the sensor detects vapor emitted from food, the remaining cooking/reheating time appears on the display. At this time, the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven may be opened to allow for stirring or seasoning of food.
- If the sensor does not detect vapor properly when cooking foods (except popcorn), ERROR appears on the display. To continue cooking, touch the STOP/CLEAR pad and cook manually.
- Check food temperature after cooking. If more time is needed, continue to cook manually.

COOKING HINT

Each Smart & Easy™ menu item has a cooking hint. To view the hint, touch the **Timer/Settings** pad when *HELP* appears on the display. Cooking hints include recommended coverings and quantity/weight ranges.

SENSOR

POPCORN, REHEAT, COOK

You can cook or reheat many foods and don't need to calculate cooking time or power level.

- 1 Touch the Cook pad.
- 2 See the Menu Label and touch a number pad to select food item.
- 3 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad. Once the vapor has been measured, the cook time appears on the display and counts down.

4 Once cooking is complete, instructions such as *STIR LET STAND* COVERED appear on the screen, depending on the food item. See the chart below for more information.

Periodically pause the microwave oven to remove or separate the defrosted portions.

If food is still frozen at the end of the estimated time, set the power level to 30% again and defrost in 1-minute increments until totally defrosted. If frozen food is in plastic containers, defrost only long enough to remove food from plastic and place it in a microwave-safe dish.

DEFROST MANUALLY

Estimate defrosting time based on the weight of the food (approximately 4 minutes per pound) and microwave at 30% power.

SOUND ON/OFF

At the end of timed cooking, an audible signal will sound. The sound can be turned off, if you prefer quiet operation.

- 1 Touch the **Timer/Settings** pad 8 times.
- 2 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad to turn Sound OFF.

To turn Sound back on, follow the same process.

REMINDER SIGNAL ON/OFF

At the end of timed cooking, an audible reminder signal will sound every 10 seconds for the first minute and every 3 minutes for up to an hour until the **STOP/CLEAR** pad is touched or the microwave oven is opened. The reminder signal can be turned off.

- 1 Touch the **Timer/Settings** pad 9 times.
- 2 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad to turn the reminder OFF.

To turn the reminder back on, follow the same process.

AUTO-START

To set the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven to cook at a designated time of day, set Auto-Start.

- 1 Touch the **Timer/Settings** pad 10 times.
- 2 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad to select Auto-Start.
- 3 Touch the number pads to enter the start time.
- 4 Touch the Timer/Settings pad.
- **5** Touch the **number** pads to enter the cooking time.
- **6** Touch the **Power Level** pad repeatedly to set the power level. If the desired power level is 100% (HIGH), proceed to the next step.
- 7 Touch the START/+30 SEC pad to set Auto-Start.

DEMONSTRATION MODE

In Demo Mode, the magnetron does not function, and the timer counts down quickly. This mode is used during sales or to explore the unit without heating.

- 1 Touch the **Timer/Settings** pad 11 times.
- **2** Touch the **START/+30 SEC** pad and hold for 3 seconds to turn on Demo Mode.

To turn Demo Mode off, follow the same process.

HELP

Each setting of the Cook and Sensor features has a cooking hint. To view the hint, touch the **Timer/Settings** pad whenever *HELP* is illuminated in the display.

+30 SEC

To cook for 30 seconds at 100% power or extend cooking times during manual cooking in multiples of 30 seconds by touching the START/+30 SEC pad within 3 minutes after cooking completion, after closing the drawer or after touching the STOP/CLEAR pad once.

Notes:

- If the STOP/CLEAR pad is touched 2 times prior to the end of cooking, +30 SEC cannot be used until the drawer has been opened and closed again.
- +30 SEC cannot be used with Sensor, Reheat or Defrost settings.

STANDBY MODE

The Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven will go into standby mode after a period of inactivity. The backlight of the display will automatically dim after 3 minutes if the unit has not been in operation. If the display is in standby mode, simply touch the control panel or open/close the door to return the backlight to maximum brightness.

CONTROL LOCK

The Control Lock prevents unwanted drawer operation such as by small children. The Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven can be set so the control panel and the automatic drawer mechanism are deactivated or locked.

TO LOCK

Touch the **STOP/CLEAR** pad and hold for 3 seconds. LOCK ON appears on the display.

To unlock controls, follow the same process again.

The Control Lock is canceled when the electrical power supply to your oven is interrupted. Set the Control Lock again when power to the oven is restored.

MULTIPLE SEQUENCE COOKING

The Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven can be programmed for up to 4 automatic cooking sequences, switching from one power level setting to another automatically.

Sometimes cooking directions tell you to start on one power level and then change to a different power level. The Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven can do this automatically.


- 1 Touch the **number** pads to enter the cooking time.
- **2** Touch the **Power Level** pad to set 100% power or repeatedly to set a lower power.
- **3** Touch the **number** pads to enter the second cooking time.
- **4** Touch the **Power Level** pad to set 100% power or repeatedly to set a lower power.
- **5** Repeat this procedure up to 4 times total for up to 4 cooking sequences then touch the **START/+30 SEC** pad.

MORE OR LESS TIME ADJUSTMENT

Should you discover that you like any of the Reheat or Defrost settings slightly more done, touch the **Power Level** pad once after touching your selection. The display will show MORE.

For slightly less done, touch the **Power Level** pad twice after touching your selection. The display will show *LESS*.

CLEANING AND CARE

EXTERIOR

The outside surface is precoated metal and glass. Clean the outside with mild soap and water; rinse and dry with a soft cloth. Do not use any type of household or abrasive cleaner.

STAINLESS STEEL SURFACE

The exterior should be wiped often with a soft damp cloth and polished with a soft dry cloth to maintain its beauty. There are also a variety of products designed especially for cleaning and shining the stainless exterior of the oven. We recommend that the cleaner be applied to a soft cloth and then carefully used on the stainless exterior rather than sprayed directly on to it. Follow package directions carefully.

FRONT SIDE OF THE DRAWER

Wipe the window on both sides with a soft damp cloth to remove any spills or spatters. Metal parts will be easier to maintain if wiped frequently with a soft damp cloth. Avoid the use of spray and other harsh cleaners as they may stain, streak or dull the drawer surface.

TOUCH CONTROL PANEL

If desired, the touch pads may be deactivated before cleaning. See the Control Lock information on page 22 of this manual. Wipe the panel with a cloth dampened slightly with water only. Dry with a soft cloth. Do not scrub or use any sort of chemical cleaners. Close drawer and follow directions on page 22 for turning Control Lock off. Touch the **STOP/CLEAR** pad.

INTERIOR

Before cleaning the Microwave Drawer, touch and hold the STOP/CLEAR pad for 3 seconds to lock the control pad and the automatic door mechanism. The drawer can be locked in either the open or closed position. The display will show LOCK ON. This will prevent the drawer from accidentally opening or closing during cleaning. After cleaning, touch and hold the STOP/CLEAR pad for 3 seconds to turn the lock off. The display will show LOCK OFF.

Cleaning is easy because no heat is generated to the interior surfaces; therefore, there is no baking and setting of spills or spattering.

To clean the interior surfaces, including drawer sealing surfaces, wipe with a soft damp cloth.

IMPORTANT: DO NOT USE ABRASIVE OR HARSH CLEANERS OR SCOURING PADS. For heavier soil, use mild soap; wipe clean with a soft damp cloth. Do not use any chemical oven cleaners.

MICROWAVE DRAWER GUIDES

Remove the food crumbs from the drawer guides. Wipe with a soft dry cloth in order to keep the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven opening and closing smoothly.

WAVEGUIDE COVER

ATTENTION The waveguide cover, located on the inside top of the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven area, is made from mica, so it requires special care. Keep the waveguide cover clean to assure good microwave performance. Carefully wipe with a soft damp cloth any food spatters from the surface of the cover immediately after they occur. Built-up splashes may overheat and cause smoke or possibly catch fire. Do not remove the waveguide cover.

ODOR REMOVAL

Occasionally, a cooking odor may remain in the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven. To remove odor, combine 1 cup water, grated peel and juice of one lemon and several whole cloves in a 2-cup glass microwave-safe measuring cup. Boil for several minutes using 100% power. Leave in the Sharp Microwave Drawer™ Oven until water cools. Wipe interior with a soft cloth.

VARIABLE POWER COOKING
